This word penetrated into Western pop culture along with the book "A Clockwork Orange" by Anthony Burgess. There is a phonetic similarity with the pronunciation of the Russian word «хорошо» ("good"), which served as the formation of this word. Example: I thought the movie was horrorshow (I thought the movie was wonderful).
